



History of Federal TRIO Programs

The history of TRIO is progressive. It began with Upward Bound, which emerged out of the Economic Opportunity Act of 1964 in response to the administration's War on Poverty. In 1965, Talent Search, the second outreach program, was created as part of the Higher Education Act. In 1968, Student Support Services, which was originally known as Special Services for Disadvantaged Students, was authorized by the Higher Education Amendments and became the third in a series of educational opportunity programs.

By the late 1960's, the term "TRIO" was coined to describe these federal programs. Over the years, the TRIO Programs have been expanded and improved to provide a wider range of services and to reach more students who need assistance. The Higher Education Amendments of 1972 added the fourth program to the TRIO group by authorizing the Educational Opportunity Centers. The Second Supplemental Appropriations Act of 1972 established Veterans Upward Bound to enable service members to ease the transition to postsecondary education. The 1976 Education Amendments authorized the Training Program for Federal TRIO Programs, initially known as the Training Program for Special Programs Staff and Leadership Personnel. Additional HEA amendments in 1986 added the seventh program, the Ronald E. McNair Post-baccalaureate Achievement Program.

Lastly, in 1990, the Department created the Upward Bound Math/Science program to address the need for specific instruction in the fields of math and science. The Upward Bound Math/Science program is administered under the same regulations as the regular Upward Bound program, but it must be applied for separately.

Finally, the Omnibus Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2001 amended the Student Support Services (SSS) program to permit the use of program funds for direct financial assistance (Grant Aid) for current SSS participants who are receiving Federal Pell Grants. The legislative requirements for all Federal TRIO Programs can be found in the Higher Education Act of 1965, Title IV, Part A, Subpart 2. The requirements for the SSS Grant Aid can be found in Public Law 106- 554. Currently the TRIO programs include eight outreach and support programs targeted to help students progress from middle school to post baccalaureate programs.

GEAR UP History & Overview

In 1998, Congress authorized the Gaining Early Awareness and Readiness for Undergraduate Programs (GEAR UP) program. The purpose of the program is to foster increased knowledge, expectations, and preparation for postsecondary education among low-income students and their families. GEAR UP projects may provide services to students, parents and teachers at high-poverty schools with at least 50 percent of students eligible for free or reduced-price lunches. Services may include: tutoring, mentoring, college field trips, career awareness, college-readiness counseling, classes, meetings, parent education about access to higher education, curriculum reform, and teacher training.

GEAR UP is based on a model of providing services to an entire grade cohort, and grantees are required to offer services to all students in the target grade or grades according to their needs, but individual participation is voluntary. The GEAR UP model also stresses partnerships of schools, districts, community organizations and post-secondary institutions. Most of the first GEAR UP grantees began by serving sixth- or seventh-graders in fall of 1999, with the intention of providing continuing services to this cohort of students as they progressed through high school.



TRIO Overview

Talent Search

TS prepares and supports individuals with assistance applying for financial aid and college admission. Services include tutoring; mentoring; counseling and coaching; exposure to college campuses; assistance with FAFSA and college applications; and entrance exam preparation. Services are available to middle school students through age 27 who may also be low-income and potential first-generation students.

Student Support Services

SSS supports first-generation, low-income, and students with disabilities to succeed academically, persist year-to-year, and graduate from college. Services include tutoring; financial, academic, and career advising; assistance with graduate and professional school preparation and applications; and financial literacy.

Upward Bound

UB prepares high school students and veterans for success in postsecondary education. Types of projects include UB Classic, Veterans UB, and UB Math & Science. Services include summer programming; instruction in math, science, and languages; tutoring; mentoring; counseling; cultural events; and financial literacy. Services are available to participants who are low-income, potential first-generation students, or academically at-risk.

McNair

McNair prepares and supports first-generation, low-income, and students from disadvantaged backgrounds with preparation for graduate education and doctoral study. Services include research opportunities, summer internships, seminars, tutoring and mentoring, academic and financial advising, and assistance securing admission to graduate school.


TRIO Overview

Educational Opportunity Center

EOC assists low-income adults who would be first-generation college students to gain admission to college and find financial assistance for their education. Services include assistance with college admission and FAFSA, entrance exam preparation, guidance on secondary school re-entry, GED access, academic and financial advising, career counseling, and financial literacy.

TRIO Training Program

Training Program for Federal TRIO Programs (known as Priority Trainings) provides federal financial assistance to train the staff and leadership personnel employed in, or preparing for employment in, TRIO programs. The topics covered in the trainings include legislative and regulatory requirements; assisting students in receiving adequate financial aid; the design and operation of model programs; the use of appropriate educational technology; and strategies for recruiting and serving hard to reach populations.

'I put my dreams on a forever-running back-burner,' she says. 'I never truly tried to pursue them, thinking of all the limitations that I had in front of me. I sincerely thank Mr. Scott for changing that.' Alexia's fluency in four languages (English, Spanish, Korean, and now Chinese) stems from a lifelong interest in languages that was cemented by a study abroad semester in South Korea last spring. This experience was so powerful that she hopes to return there once she graduates with a major in international studies and a minor in English. To this end, she is currently in the process of applying for a post-graduate Fulbright Scholarship that would fund her teaching English in a South Korean high school for a year. Meanwhile, she is preparing to teach ESL by interning with the ILUNO program at UNO, where she will soon be teaching lessons, and working as a teacher at the Huntington Learning Center tutoring students in reading and writing in preparation for ACT tests. In her "spare" time, Alexia serves as president of Project Achieve's Students Against Hunger organization for which she has spearheaded the establishment of an urban garden at 40th and Charles, as well as efforts to move that organization into a community non-profit organization."





"Phadiziana Smith-Whiteside didn't know a single family member – parents, grandparents, siblings, aunts, uncles or cousins – who had attended college. 'Leaving high school was a big transition,' she said. 'I had to look up YouTube videos of freshmen moving in because I didn't know anything. Should I bring a mirror? Do they have a checklist? Is that a thing?' An Omaha Northwest High School graduate, Smith-Whiteside also was homeless for several months during her senior year and the summer after graduation as she prepared for college. And she continuously worried about her health – the effects of diabetes and a tumor diagnosis. Despite these obstacles, she persevered and is now excelling as a sophomore at the University of Nebraska at Kearney.

Right away, she joined TRIO Student Support Services, a federally funded program that provides academic and personal support, financial guidance and career development opportunities to first-generation and income-qualified students and those with documented disabilities. Her TRIO adviser, Bambi Sell, connected her with an English tutor who taught her research paper formats. This was especially beneficial to Smith-Whiteside, who wasn't required to write papers in APA or MLA styles at her high school. 'It was really nice to have Bambi there guiding me through everything and to have that type of support,' Smith-Whiteside said."
